

dollars and the said Joseph T. Council and James M. Council in the sum of One hundred dollars each of their respective goods and chattels lands and Tenements to be levied and to the said Governor and his Successors in the Office of Governor to the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if the said William T. Council shall keep the peace and be of good behavior towards the Commonwealth and all its Citizens more especially towards the said Patrick Diles for the space of twelve months from this day then this recognizance to be void.

Jeremiah Sogner who stands bound by recognizance for his appearance here to answer the complaint of William Gardner against him for a breach of the peace appeared in Court in discharge of his recognizance and the said William Gardner being sworn and examined and the said Sogner by Council fully heard the Court after hearing the testimony are of opinion and so therefore order that the said Sogner give Security for keeping the peace for the term of twelve months from this day that is to say the said Sogner to be bound in the sum of twenty dollars with two sureties in the sum of ten dollars each and that he pay the costs of this prosecution. And therefore the said Sogner with James T. French and William C. Sparks his sureties have in Court severally acknowledged themselves indebted unto John Rutherford Esq. Sheriff of the County acting as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia the said Jeremiah Sogner in the sum of twenty dollars and his said sureties in the sum of ten dollars each of their respective goods and chattels lands and Tenements to be levied and to the said Governor and his Successors in Office to the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if the said Jeremiah Sogner shall keep the peace and be of good behavior towards all the Citizens of this Commonwealth more especially towards William Gardner for the term of twelve months from this day then this recognizance to be void.

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James M. Council who stands bound by recognizance for his appearance here to answer the complaint of Patrick Diles against him for a breach of the peace appeared in discharge of his recognizance. Whereupon it is ordered that the said complaint be dismissed; and that Patrick Diles the prosecutor pay the costs of this prosecution.

At the motion of Nicholas M. Debill who made oath and together with Bradley Hill Jains and William J. Debill his sureties entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, certificate is granted him for Attorney's fees of administration on the estate of Clements Debill deceased in due form.

Ordered that James M. Debill, F. J. Nichols, Thomas C. Jones and Samuel P. Mathews or any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of Clements Debill deceased and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

Ordered that the account of Benjamin C. Everett amounting to \$126 cents and Nathan Barnes amounting to \$168 cents be severally certified to the Auditor of Public Accounts for his examination and payment.
