On motion of the plaintiffs Littleton R. Edwards is assigned guardian ad litem to the
infant defendant Hannah T. Pierce to defend her in this suit. This cause came on this
day to be decided and heard by a court of parties on the bill of the complainants and the
answer of the defendants upon consideration whereof the Court with advice, order and decree
that Rice D. Pierce administrator of Peter J. Pierce and as later guardian of William C.
Pierce settle an account of his transactions in both characters before Littleton R. Edwards
who is hereby appointed a special Commissioner for that purpose and that he pay out to
Jeremiah Bell in right of his wife Elizabeth one half of whatever may be due to the said
William C. Pierce on either account advancing the other moiety as guardian of his ward
Hannah T. Pierce. And that John Wick, Robert Ricks, Gilbert Wick and John Wick
who are appointed as Commissioners for the purpose; any three of whom may act, divide the
slaves belonging to the estate of William C. Pierce deceased into two equal parts, all things
due to Jeremiah Bell in right of his wife Elizabeth and the other to Rice D. Pierce as guardian
of Hannah T. Pierce. and that they make report to this Court in order to a final decree.

The Commissioners appointed by the Court, do hereby docket, make up and come a bill of partition
between the said Anne Eliza, Caroline Ricks and the said Robert Ricks in the premises and the said
include the following report. On Partition of the premises, docketed for the County Court of
Southampton dated November 1850. The bill sets forth the land assigned to the Commissioners, have agreed
it to assign to the complainants, Samuel O. Dorr, and Anne Eliza his wife late Anne
Eliza Ricks one fourth part of the lands and slaves in the bill mentioned. He as-
signed to them the following places to-wit: Slaves valued at \$500. Land \$500. Sugar
100. Oranges 300. = \$1400. - He by leave here to amend the report of the County Court
and admit it as a report of the fourth part of the lands assigned to the above named
Complainants



There is the proportion of land allotted by the Commissioners in the division of Odwin Ricks's
land to Samuel O. Dorr containing 288 acres, and bounded as follows commencing at the
road of the Desaugers Swamp and running the various courses of said swamp to its junction
