

Deed of bargain and sale from Benjamin Branch to Thomas Dablow Sheriff conveying a tract of land containing 152 acres more or less also the following property delivered up in a schedule to wit 65 acres land one cow more five further cows and furniture two cows three horses and twenty five pigs crop of corn and fodder still corn and wood cut and horse cart and wheel barrels and kitchen furniture was acknowledged in the Clerk's office on the 28th of January 1832 by Benjamin Branch and recorded to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Joseph T. Colman and Elizabeth his wife to John A. Paine and Benjamin Williams conveying two shares of a cotton mill and mill seat of which John Paine was seized and possessed was acknowledged in the Clerk's office on the 2nd of January 1832 by Joseph T. Colman and having been before previously in the Clerk's office on the 22nd of January 1832 by David Newson one of the witnesses thereto is together with the Certificate of the jury examination unacknowledged of the wife submitted to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Joseph T. Colman and Elizabeth his wife to John A. Paine conveying a tract of land containing 285 acres more or less was acknowledged in the Clerk's office on the 27th of January 1832 by Joseph T. Colman and together with the Certificate of the jury examination and acknowledgment of the wife submitted to Record.

Deed of trust between Edward Maxwell and Mary his wife of the first part William A. Jones of the second part and Joseph T. Colman of the third part conveying a tract of land containing two hundred and eighty eight acres more or less all his the said Maxwell household and kitchen furniture one saddle and bridle one jersey saddle and harness one cart and wheel carrying barrels all his stock of horses mules cattle pigs and crop of every description was acknowledged in the Clerk's office on the 27th of January 1832 by William A. Jones and Joseph T. Colman two of the parties thereto and together with the Certificate of the acknowledgment of Maxwell and jury examination of the wife submitted to Record.

Deed of release from William A. Jones and Edward P. Palmer to James G. Jones releasing one negro slave named Jimmy was acknowledged in the Clerk's office on the 27th of January 1832 by William A. Jones one of the parties thereto and submitted to Record.

Deed of trust between John Thompson of the first part William R. Dablow of the second part and Edward Dablow of the third part conveying a tract of land containing 200 acres more or less also the following slaves named Sam Harris woman Betie and Chito Prior and by Master was acknowledged in the Clerk's office on the 29th of January 1832 by all the parties thereto and submitted to Record.

Deed of trust between Samuel P. Nicholson of the first part William R. Dablow of the second part and William A. Sparks of the third part conveying the following slaves to wit Ephie and her future increase by Bond and Master was acknowledged in the Clerk's office on the 25th of January 1832 by Samuel P. Nicholson one of the parties thereto and submitted to Record.

Deed of trust between Nathaniel Day of the first part John R. Day and of the second part and Miles Cook of the third part conveying 2 acres 7 rods all his the said Day's crop of corn and fodder cart and wheel household and kitchen furniture one cow more furniture was acknowledged in the Clerk's office on the 2nd of February 1832 by all the parties thereto and submitted to Record.
