

Survey of Daniel & H. Pond's land conveyed to Fabrice St. Hollings & Arthur C. Darrow, made the 4th of August 1861, under an order of Court for allotting to the widow of Fabrice St. Hollings dec'd her dower, commencing at a stone at the mouth of the Spring Lane (so called) a narrow thicket and Woods line, and running N 2 W 79° 44' poles to a white oak stone N 3 E 32° 28' a pine N 3° 46' 45" to a small spruce tree in Darrow's lot N 7° W 31° 48' a pine N 3 W 49° 42' 44" a red oak tree in Darrow's fence in Woods line N 8° E 23° 20' a pine N 59° E 42° 44' a Red oak tree S of Spring Hill E 100° 74' N 60° E 10° 12' R. O. stone alone of marked trees to a branch, thence down the branch to a Bl. gum a corner on hill, then thence N 7° E 11° 10' a Red oak tree near J. Kitchen's fence stones N 15° E 77° 08' a pine on branch in Woods line of N W 12° 36' a pine tree on Woods line in a branch, thence along S. branch to a Bl. gum, thence up a branch to a pine, thence to a Bl. gum on edge of a meadow, a tree in lawn, thence up the meadow to a pine near road, thence N 4° E 33° 28' to a Red oak on Road, thence along said road to the beginning, containing 406 1/2 acres, of which was allotted to widow by her husband by deed -

Agreeable to an order of the County Court of Southampton made July Court and directed and we, Shugars Lain, John W. Holland and Joseph Gardner, Commissioners appointed, proceeded accompanied by the County Surveyor, to survey and allot to Mrs. Mary Pond her dower in the land belonging thereto to the estate of Fabrice Pond dec'd and after a due examination and valuation of the same, have come to the conclusion that by acres including the improvements, is a full proportion and as such have allotted the same to her during her natural life, as will be seen by the enclosed plan.
