Urquhart, James Murphy, and Hattie Lawrence who are hereby appointed Commissioners for the purpose - members of whom may sit, shall proceed to divide the slaves mentioned in the said bill, into two equal parts, altho' next to the legatees and distributees of the said Samuel Story, and the other to the distributees of said Margaret Gray; and that the said Commissioners do further proceed to sell the moiety assigned to the distributees of the said Margaret Gray, as well as the tenth of land of which she died, seized and possessed, containing fifty, feet the family being of ground, at public auction to the highest bidder on a credit of nine months after giving twenty days public notice of the time and place of sale, taking care with sufficient security of the purchase
