This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and it appearing to the Court that the defendant had had legal notice of this motion he was solemnly called but came not. Therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the defendant the sum of Twenty one dollars and thirty seven cents being the amount which the plaintiff paid to John Vick administrator of Daniel Vick dec'd sum of the Defendant's security - with legal interest thereon from the 5th day of August 1834 till paid, and his costs by him about this suit in this behalf expended. And the said Defendant in May 1835.

On the motion of Henry Richards against George Spring, Richards A. Vengrue and James B. Vengrue. This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and it appearing to the Court that the defendants George M. Spring and Richards A. Vengrue had had legal notice of this motion they were solemnly called but came not. Therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendants George M. Spring and Richards A. Vengrue the sum of \$46.47 cents with interest thereon from the 1st day of October 1833 till paid, the further sum of \$10.28 cents with interest thereon from the 15th day of February 1834 till paid; the further sum of \$5.34 cents with interest from the 15th day of February 1834 till paid; the further sum of \$15.98 cents with interest from the 15th day of May 1834 till paid and the further sum of \$4.75 cents with interest from the 15th day of September 1834 till paid, and his costs by him about this motion in this behalf expended. And the said Defendants in May 1835.

This cause came on this day to be heard by consent on the bill, answers of the Defendants and the exhibits filed and by the like consent was decreed and argued by consent: On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that James D. Thompson, James Munroe, and Miles Lawrence who are hereby appointed Commissioners for the purpose, any two of whom may act, shall proceed to divide the slaves mentioned in the said bill, into two equal parts, assigning one to the legatee and distributees of the said Samuel Story, and the other to the distributees of said Margaret Story: and that the said Commissioners do further proceed to sell the unity assigned to the distributees of the said Margaret Story, as well as the third of land of which she died seized and possessed, nowing fifty feet the family buying ground, at public auction to the highest bidder on a credit of nine months after giving thirty days notice of the time and place of sale, taking bond with sufficient security of the purchaser
