On the motion of Thomas J. Dyer. Ordered that Masters Commissioners sell certain slaves and settle an account of the said Dyer's administration in John J. Deal's estate and make report thereof to Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or which may be required to state.

Pierce had been held together for their joint benefit and consequently the Court had first to make a division between Henrietta J. Wm. B. Pierce agreeably to the following statement—
