The Committee on the cause this day made their report in the following words to wit
Pursuant to the unexecuted decree in the undersigned Committee have divided into three parts
the slaves held by Martha Stevens widow of David Stevens dec'd for life as we could not effect
a division without a sale to all to the extent of Martha Stevens die in number & value of slaves
decreed we have disregarded that part of the decree as we were directed to do and divided the
slaves into three parts which is as follows First Frank and Martha an old & ill valued at
\$575. and drawn by Henry Moore guardian for Rebecca Stevens, deduct for keeping old slaves
Dinah her life time which which we find to be worth \$102 leaves a balance of \$475. When minus
from lot No 2 the sum of \$310 which makes \$165 which is now my portion of said slaves
lot No 2 Agnes and Tammy valued to \$450. drawn by David Stevens and minus
from lot No 3 the sum of \$330. makes the amount of his portion. Lot No 3 Con. Eliza &
Child valued to \$225. and drawn by John A Person administrator of Sally Person wife latey Stevens
which he has to pay to No 1 the sum of \$310 and to No 2 the sum of \$375 dollars which leave
the sum of \$6375 dollars the rest of his portion. which we finally submit to the Court
