The Commissioners in this cause this day made their report which is in these words "February 15th 1842 In obedience to a decree of the Court of Southampton signed at its February term we John S. Bunting, Samuel H. Adams, P. H. Darby and R. A. Hargreave divided the lands late the property of Lucy and Sally Harris into two equal parts, by running a direct line from a forked pine formerly a side line of the mansion tract to a hickwood post at the head of a bottom a side line between the mansion tract and Charles land, cutting off from the mansion tract and adding to the red house tract five rows apple trees giving thereby about thirty acres of the mansion tract to the red house tract. We further subject the red house tract to supply the mansion tract annually with enough pine timber to split one thousand rails for the repairing and keeping up the entrance of the mansion tract. We the aforesaid Commissioners do assign to Catharine Proffer in his next right the mansion tract and to the heirs of the late Joel Proffer or all the red house tract, whole tract nature is by the last will and Testament of the late Joel Proffer bequeathed to his widow during her life. In witness whereof we have here set our hands this day and date above written. John S. Bunting, Samuel H. Adams, P. H. Darby, R. A. Hargreave."
