The Commissioner in this cause this day made a report in these words "In obedience
to the aforesaid decree I after advertising the time and place of sale as directed by the Court
proceeded on the 27th December, 1821 at Drury's Store to sell the negro slaves belonging to the
estate of Lucy Stevens ^{de}d. upon a credit of nine months. Taking bonds with appropriate security
of the purchasers. Your Commissioner begs leave to state that the bonds were all made
payable to himself as Commissioner, for the whole amount of the purchase money. He found it
impracticable, there being many legacies & the exact number not yet known. to distribute the amounts
so as to give to each of the legatees their proportion without cutting or parceling each purchased bond
into several parts, which was objected to by some purchasers. He now holds 3rd bonds in his hands sub-
ject to the further order of the Court, which he is willing to collect if a desire so ordered. The
amount account of sales will show the am^t. of sale together with the sum of the purchases. All
of which is respectively submitted.
