The Commissioners in this cause this day made a report in these words to wit: In obedience to the annexed decree. I after advertising the time and place of sale as directed by the decree proceeded on the 27<sup>th</sup> December, 1841 at Druggs Store to sell the negro slaves belonging to the estate of Lucy Atkinson dec<sup>d</sup> upon a credit of nine months, taking bonds with approved security of the purchasers. Your Commissioners begs leave to state that the bonds were all made payable to himself as Commissioner, for the whole amount of the purchase money. He found it impracticable, there being many legacies of the said number not yet turned, so to appraise the amounts as to give to each of the legacies their proportions without cutting or parcelling each purchase bond into several parts, which was objected to by s<sup>d</sup> purchasers. He now holds s<sup>d</sup> bonds in his hands subject to the further order of the Court, which he is willing to collect & disburse if so ordered. The annexed account of sales will show the amt<sup>y</sup> of sales together with the names of the purchasers. A bill of which is respectfully submitted.
