

March 21<sup>st</sup> 1842. Peter D. Becknow Commissary. This day this cause came on  
again to be heard on the papers formerly read and was argued by Counsel. On consideration  
whereof and it appearing to the Court that its likely that other debts may yet come against the  
estate of Lucy Weston dec<sup>d</sup>. it is ordered, adjudged and decreed that the legatees of said  
estate, shall upon the receipt of their legacies<sup>s</sup> execute to the Comptroller refusing bonds in several  
form of law. And that the Commissaries hand over to Robert Ritchie and Daniel Lyon  
trustees of John W. Gauthier and wife, bonds to the amount of one half of one seventh of  
the amount of said debts or expenses of costs of suit.

The Commissioners in this cause this day made their report in these words to the Court December fourt 1840. Mr Edward Beaton Henry Headford and James Jackson Commiss<sup>r</sup>s appointed  
to sell one third part of the estate of Aubin Middleton dec<sup>d</sup> to Sarah Giles late widow of Aubin  
Middleton dec<sup>d</sup> in trust for life as owner of the slaves and real estate of which said Aubin H. Giles  
left said and proposed and the remaining two thirds of said estate divide into three  
equal parts allotting one equal third to Julia Ann, the other two thirds to Arthur and George  
infant heirs left by Aubin Middleton dec<sup>d</sup> and the said Julia Ann having disposed of her  
life interest her portion of personal estate into three equal parts and allotting an equal third to  
Joseph T. Giles in right of his wife Sarah and the other two thirds to Arthur and George  
- & Mr. Allen to Sarah Giles one third part as owner of slaves, also Bank Nancy Lucy Fonda  
David & Joseph Weales also to Arthur and George heirs of s<sup>d</sup> descendant also Jacob, Jerry,  
Jacob, Billy & Lydia. We also allot one third part to Julia Ann third of slaves to Joseph  
T. Giles in right of his wife Sarah, also Malinda and the other two thirds to Arthur & George  
infant heirs left by Aubin Middleton dec<sup>d</sup> Also Thomas, Anthony & Ceran. We also allot  
to Sarah Giles one third part of real estate line commencing at the corner of his small  
black guns, red oak & water oak a new corner made in James Jacksons line at the north ridge  
of Bullhorn swamp thence N 42 $\frac{1}{4}$  E 42 $\frac{1}{4}$  poles to the run of the flat swamp - (now)  
in Edwin Harris line 281 rods for s<sup>d</sup> slaves the remaining two thirds for Arthur & George  
heirs of s<sup>d</sup> descendant - Given under my hand this 15<sup>th</sup> day of January 1842. (Signed)
