John A Hall who was arrested under a warrant issued by Jere Cobb a Justice of the Peace for this County upon the complaint of Priscilla Ovington against him for a breach of the peace was this day brought into Court and thereupon the said Priscilla Ovington and sundry witnesses being sworn and examined and the said Hall by Counsel fully heard. The Court after hearing the evidence doth order that the said John A Hall do find Security for keeping the peace for the term of twelve months from this day, the said to be bound in the sum of two hundred dollars with two securities in the sum of One hundred dollars each. And that the said Hall do also pay the costs of this prosecution. Whereupon the said John A Hall with Richard A Vaughan and William C Bond his securities here in Court severally acknowledged themselves indebted unto John Rutherford Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia, the said John A Hall in the sum of two hundred dollars and the said Richard A Vaughan and William C Bond in the sum of One hundred dollars each of their respective goods and Chattels, lands and Tenements to be levied on to the said Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor of the said Commonwealth to the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if the said John A Hall shall keep the peace and be of good behavior towards all the Citizens of the Commonwealth more especially towards Priscilla Ovington for the term of twelve months from this day then this recognizance to be void.

John A Hall who has been arrested under a warrant issued by Jeremiah Cobb a Justice of the Peace for this County upon the complaint of Bennett P Stephenson against him for a breach of the peace was this day brought into Court and thereupon the said Bennett P Stephenson and sundry witnesses were sworn and examined and the said Hall by Counsel fully heard. The Court after hearing the evidence doth order that the said John A Hall give Security for keeping the peace for the term of twelve months from this day, the said John A Hall to be bound in the sum of two hundred dollars with two securities in the sum of One hundred dollars each. And that the said John A Hall pay the costs of this prosecution. Whereupon the said John A Hall with Richard A Vaughan and William C Bond his securities here in Court severally acknowledged themselves indebted unto John Rutherford Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia the said Hall in the sum of two hundred dollars and his said securities in the sum of One hundred dollars each of their respective goods and Chattels, lands and Tenements to be levied on to the said Governor and his Successors in the Office of Governor to the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if the said John A Hall shall keep the peace and be of good behavior towards all the Citizens of the Commonwealth more especially towards the said Bennett P Stephenson for the term of twelve months from this day then this recognizance to be void.
