

James M. Daily is appointed Surveyor of the roads from the head waters at James R. Vaughan's to Proctors road in the town of Westport District. And it is ordered that the usual bonds be sent thereto.

On the motion Edwards Beale setting forth that he is bound in this Court as security for Jeph Darrow for his due and faithful administration of the estate of William White Lee<sup>2</sup> and that he conceives himself to be in danger of suffering damages by reason thereof and praying the Court for relief. Ordered that the said Jeph Darrow be summoned to the first day of the next Term to show cause why he should not be rated to give the said Beale good and sufficient security or to execute a new bond with security as the law directs.

Ordered that Colleton H. Edwards who is hereby appointed Special Commissioner for this purpose, shall settle and adjust an account of Jeph Darrow's administration on Williams Whites estate and make report thereof to Court.

On the motion of Silas Barnes Esq<sup>r</sup> against William Holt, Thomas R. Bowles and Mills Pepe.  
This day came the plaintiffs by their attorney and it appearing to the Court that the defendants William Holt and Mills Pepe have had legal notice of the action they were solemnly called but came not. Therefore it was considered by the Court that the plaintiffs recover against the defendants Holt and Pepe for four  $\frac{7}{10}$  dollars with interest thereon from the 8<sup>th</sup> day of August 1839 till paid, for sixteen  $\frac{1}{2}$  dollars with interest from the 11<sup>th</sup> of June 1839 till paid, for eight dollars with interest from the 12<sup>th</sup> June 1839 till paid, for nineteen  $\frac{1}{2}$  dollars with interest from the 9<sup>th</sup> of May 1838 till paid, for fourteen  $\frac{3}{4}$  dollars with interest from 12<sup>th</sup> June 1839 till paid, for four dollars with interest from 19<sup>th</sup> March 1839 till paid, for seven  $\frac{1}{2}$  dollars with interest from September 15<sup>th</sup> 1839 till paid, for five  $\frac{3}{4}$  dollars with interest from 12<sup>th</sup> February 1839 till paid, in three  $\frac{1}{2}$  dollars with interest from June 15<sup>th</sup> 1839 till paid, for eight  $\frac{3}{4}$  dollars, for one  $\frac{3}{4}$  dollars, for six dollars with interest from 27<sup>th</sup> April 1839 till paid, for one  $\frac{2}{3}$  dollars with interest from the 20<sup>th</sup> March 1839 till paid, for twelve  $\frac{1}{2}$  dollars with interest from 25<sup>th</sup> March 1839 till paid and for the sum of fifteen dollars with interest from the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of March 1839 till paid and their costs by them about their action in this behalf expended. And the said defendants in Mercy.

Edward Edwards nephew of James H. Edwards Esq<sup>r</sup> with the approbation of the said under Sheriff of Anthonay Vaughan for his guardian and therefore the said Anthony Vaughan with Harrison Holt and Thomas Vaughan his Committee returned into and acknowledged at hand in the penalty of five hundred dollars consterned as the law directs.
