The Commissioners in this cause this day made their report in these words to wit.
In conformity to the annexed decree, we the undersigned Commissioners who are appointed by the County Court of Southampton to sell the tract of land that Patsy Turner died seized and possessed of, have after advertising the same as we were directed sold to the highest bidder on the premises the 9th day of April 1842 the tract of land mentioned in the bill containing 25 acres and William Harris became the purchaser for the sum of twenty five dollars. Collets fee \$2.38 and the Commissioners one dollar and 25 cents, making in the aggregate \$11.13. this sum taken from \$25.00 the amount sold leaves \$14.87. This last sum is divided into three equal parts making the sum of four dollars 79 cents each one part and we have taken three bonds from William Harris & Ben Griffin his security for the sum of \$4.79 cents and have paid them over to the distributees as named in the decree, say one to Edw. W. Davis, one to Bennett Griffin and the other one to William Harris. Given under our hands this 9th day of April 1842. Ben Griffin, Edw. W. Davis Commissioners.

The Commissioners appointed to let the repairs of the bridge across Mapenbungs mill race this day made their report which is ordered to be recorded and is in these words to wit.
"Agreeably to the annexed order. I Jas. W. Musfee with Mills Musfee and William Peale proceeded to advertise and did on the 20th of last November let at public auction to the lowest undertaker the repairs of the bridge across Mapenbungs Mill race all of which was to be accepted the best place and any sound mud sills when and where Mills Musfee and William Peale became the undertakers for two hundred and forty nine dollars. Given under my hand this 18th of April 1842. \$249.00.
