In pursuance of the within order I advertised the boy not less than 30 days and at several public places and on the 17th day of April 1851 it being Court day I put him up at public auction in the Court of General Sessions. The sum was six hundred by the purchaser giving his bond with security before the property was delivered, he was purchased by John Godwin of Kentucky for two hundred and fifty dollars he being a stranger was unable to comply with the terms of the sale as above stated he paid the money which is yet in my hands and subject to the executors of Abram Parker dec'd. Below under my hand this the 18th day of April 1852. Wm. Burch Jr Commissioner.

Ordered that the unadministered estate of Nathaniel Rockells deceased be committed to the hands of William A. Everett, Sheriff of this County for administration according to law.

An Account of General Vaughan's guardianship of Robert E. Gardner was returned and ordered to be recorded.

On the motion of James Drake for leave to alter a Road &c. Ordered that Elijah Sawyer, Jason Dow & John Moore Jr bring sword before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose view the way proposed by the said James Drake for altering the road as well as the present way and report to the Court the comparative convenience and inconveniences that will result as well to individuals as to the public if such alteration be made as proposed.

On the motion of Iros. Juras, Indian, Ordered that he be exempt from the payment of taxes and tares in future.

Ordered that Master Commissioner Cobb examine, state and settle an account of James Blayors administration on Peter Jammerills estate and make report thereon to Court with any matter specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or which he may be required to state.

On the motion of Cathelbert D. Barnard. Ordered that Thomas D. Morell who is appointed Special Commissioner for the purpose, state, settle and adjust an account of the said Barnards administration on James Rockells estate and make report thereon to Court.

If appearing to the Court that Tom Stewart a mulatto boy who has been committed to the jail of this County as a runaway, is a free boy. It is therefore ordered that the said Tom Stewart be discharged from imprisonment and be freed out by the Justic for the payment of his passage and other expenses.

On the motion of Thomas G. Weston against Horace D. Hale, Edward Weston and Levi Waller. This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and it appearing to the Court that the Defendants Weston and Waller have had legal notice of this motion they were duly called but came not. Therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff stand against the Defendants Weston and Waller the sum of seventeen dollars twenty five cents with
