

"In pursuance of the within order I advertised the boy not less than 30 days and at several public places and on the 19th day of April 1821 it being Court day I put him up at public auction in the Court of Jurisdiction the terms was his master by the purchaser giving his bond with security before the property was delivered, he was purchased by John Graham of Kentucky for two hundred and fifty dollars he being a stranger and unable to comply with the terms of the sale as above stated he paid the money which is yet in my hands and subject to the Executors of Benjamin Perkins dec'd. Given under my hand this the 18th day of April 1821. Wiley Barker Jr. Commissioner."

Ordered that the unadministered estate of Nathaniel Doehle be committed to the hands of William L. Covert, Sheriff of this County for administration according to law.

An Account of Samuel Vaughan guardian of Benjamin C. Gardner was returned and ordered to be recorded.

On the motion of James Drake for leave to alter a Road &c. Ordered that Elijah Jagers, James Rose & John Moore Jr. being sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose view the way proposed by the said James Drake for altering the road as well as the present way and report to the Court the comparative convenience and inconvenience that will result as well to individuals as to the public if such alteration be made as is proposed.

On the motion of John Turner, Indian, Ordered that he be exempt from the payment of taxes and levies in future.

Ordered that Master Commissioner Coll examine, settle and settle an account of James Blaylock administration on Elias Summerville estate and make report thereof to Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or which he may be required to state.

On the motion of Catherine D. Warham. Ordered that Thomas W. Morrell who is appointed Special Commissioner for the purpose stated settle and adjust an account of the said Warham administration on James Rockelle estate and make report thereof to Court.

It appearing to the Court that Tom Stewart a mulatto boy who has been committed to the jail of this County as a runaway is a free boy. It is therefore ordered that the said Tom Stewart be discharged from imprisonment and be hired out by the Sailer for the payment of his poundage and other expenses.

On the motion of Thomas B. Denton against Thomas B. Denton Edward Denton and Levi Waller. This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and at appearing in the Court that the Defendants Denton and Waller have had legal notice of this motion they were solemnly called but came not. Therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the Defendants Denton and Waller the sum of Seventy dollars security his costs with
