This day this cause was docketed by leave of Court and amount of process and came
to be heard on the bill and answer and was argued by Counsel. On Consideration whereof the Court
the Court doth order, adjudge and decree that Thomas Horrold, John Ellworthy and Benjamin
Bayer be appointed Commissioners, any two of whom may act, that they divide, Let the 2^d
as designated in S. Clause of Holladay Revell will, into three parts of equal value, and
allot one part to Benjamin Revell for life, remainder to his children, One part to William
Revell to him and his heirs forever, and the other third to Robert Revell to him and his
heirs forever - that the said Commissioners also divide the estate real contained in S.
Clause of the will into two equal parts, and allot one to Henry Whitefield on fee simple,
and sell to the highest bidder the other half, it being the part to which Benjamin Whitefield
would have been entitled had he survived the Testator Holladay Revell - for cash out
of which they shall first pay the costs of this decree and then pay the balance over to Augustus
Pope executor of Holladay Revell who is required to disburse the same amongst the sons
of B Revell and report to Court on order to a final decree.

Ordered that the Sheriff summon the acting Justices of this County to the first day of the next Term
to receive or reject the provisions contained in the first and second sections of the Act entitled
"An act to provide for the opening and repair of the public roads in this Commonwealth"
passed March 3^d 1855.

Ordered that Jesse Sanford, James Holmes and Owen Powers with Commissioners
appointed by the Court of Sale of Wright County do let to the lowest bidder the repairs
of Jaques bridge across Black Mtn River, receive the same when completed and make
report thereof to Court.

Ordered that the unadministered estate of William Wade de^d be committed to the hands of
William L Corbett Sheriff of this County for administration according to law.

The summons awarded at the last Term against George Williams to appear on the 2^d day
