This day this cause was docketed by leave of Court and consent of parties and came on
to be heard on the bill and answer and was argued by Counsel. On Consideration whereof the Court
the Great debt order adjudged and doth that Thomas Horrell, Silas Elliott and Benjamin
Bryant be appointed Commissioners, any two of whom may act, that they divide Lot No 2
as designated in 3^d Clause of Holladay Roville will into three parts of equal value, and
allow one part to Benjamin Roville for life, remainder to his children. One part to William
Roville to him and his heirs forever, and the other third to Robert Roville to him and his
heirs forever - that the said Commissioners also divide the estate field mentioned in 4^d
Clause of the will into two equal parts, and allow one to Nancy Whitfield in fee simple
and sell to the highest bidder the other half, being the part to which Benjamin Whitfield
would have been entitled had he survived the testator Holladay Roville - for each part
of which they shall first pay the costs of this decree, and then pay the balance over to Augustus
Pipe executor of Holladay Roville who is required to distribute the same amongst the sons
of S. Roville and report to Court in order to a final decree.

Ordered that the Sheriff summon the acting Justices of the County to the first day of April next
to receive or reject the provisions contained in the first and second Sections of the Act intituled
"An act to provide for the opening and repair of the public roads in this Commonwealth"
passed March 3^d 1835.

Ordered that Joseph Lambford, James Holmes and Gavv Bowes with Commissioners
appointed by the Court of Isle of Wight County do let to the lowest bidder the repair
of Jaques Bridge across Black Water River, never the same when completed and make
report thereof to Court -

Ordered that the unadministered estate of William Knobell be committed to the hands of
William L. Everett Sheriff of this County for administration according to law.
