The Commissioners in this cause this day made the following report. Pursuant to the aforesaid order are the Commissioners this day proceeded to sell the tract of Land named in the decree belonging to the estate of William J. Magot deceased on a credit of six months to the highest bidder, after having advertised the same one month as directed when Everett et al Court became the purchaser at the sum of one hundred and forty seven dollars fourty cents and the said Everett et al Court after paying or back the sum of twenty dollars to defray expenses received two separate bonds payable the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January next, one to Arthur C. Magot and one to Mrs. Mary J. Brattle each for forty two dollars & 59 cents with Henry A. Williams security and the said Everett et al Court affixed his receipt in sight of his wife & child Mary Jane Lewis to the same for the other third remaining to forty one dollars & 59 cents which said bonds have been paid over to their respective owners. One to Arthur C. Magot and one to Mrs. Mary J. Brattle who gave their receipts for the same. Given under our hands Sealed this 11<sup>th</sup> day of July 1842. James Magot, Lewis Everett.
