Williams at his store, the said Neeson at Jerusalem the said James J. Williams at his house near the flat swamp, the said Joseph H. Bartham at Bethlehem & Woods, the said Rose at the Crop Keys, the said Mahone at Jerusalem the said Drury at Jerusalem and the said Beaton at Dogtown Depot, till May last next. It appearing to the Court that the several applicants are men of good character and not addicted to drunkenness or gaming.

Ordered that Alexander Briggs, Erwin Adams, David Prince and Louis Harris or any three of them let to the lowest under taker the repair of the bridges called Mason's Mill swamp bridges, repair the same when complete and make report thereof to this Court.

Deed of trust between Jacob H. Dardeau of the first part, Edward Beaton of the second part and Richard A. Hale and Henry Hinckley of the third part, was acknowledged by the said Dardeau, Beaton and Hinckley and ordered to be recorded.

Patrick Dole having obtained an attachment against the Estate of Edwin Hale who has removed out of this County severally or ascended so that the ordinary process of Law cannot be served upon him, for the sum of ten dollars with interest thereon from the first day of October 1831 etc paid, and the constable having made return "Brought by Wm. Stephenson." The said attachment is continued till the next term.

For reasons appearing to the Court. Ordered that the overseers of the Poor send Harriet Johnson child of Abby Johnson to Thomas Danford according to Law. That the said Danford pay \$10. annually for the service of the said Harriet Johnson, the ten dollars for the last year's service to be paid the appraiser the residue of the service of said apprentice to be paid to the master.

On the motion of June West. Ordered that Henry Hinckley administrator of J. West do pay to the said June West the sum of \$120. for the board and clothing of James R. West orphan of J. West, and the like sum of \$120. for the board & clothing of Henry R. West orphan of said J. West.
