The Account Current and Comptroller's report of Guthbert D. Barkham's administration on the Estate of Frances E. Rockwell was returned and ordered to lie on the table for exceptions.

On the motion of John M. Neal, Vick & Drury, James J. Williams, James J. Neeson, James James Joseph H. Barkham, Sampson C. Kane, Felling J. Mahone, Horace Drury and Edward Beaton who severally produced to the Court the Sheriff's receipt for the tax imposed by law a license is granted them to keep an Ordinary in the County, that is to say the said Neal at Newsums Depot, the said Vick & Drury at Victorville, the said James J. Williams at his store, the said Neeson at Jerusalem, the said James James at his house near the flat swamp, the said Joseph H. Barkham at Bethelham & Roads, the said Kane at the Lupton, the said Mahone at Jerusalem, the said Drury at Jerusalem and the said Beaton at Daytime Depot, till May Court next. It appearing to the Court that the several applicants are men of good character and not addicted to drunkenness or gaming.

Ordered that Alexander Briggs, Isaac Adams, David Prince and Louis Harris or any three of them let to the lowest undertaker the repairs of the bridges called Mesmo Mill swamp bridges, receive the same when complete and make report thereof to the Court.

Deed of trust between Jacob H. Darden of the first part, Edward Beaton of the second part and Richard A. Beale and Henry Kindred of the third part, was acknowledged by the said Darden, Beaton and Kindred and ordered to lie on the table.

Patrick Dolan having obtained an attachment against the estate of Edwin Beale who has removed out of this County foritally or absconded so that the ordinary process of law cannot be served upon him for the sum of five dollars with interest thereon from the first day of October 1831 till paid, and the Court able having made return "to search By Wm. R. Stephenson." The said attachment is continued till the next term.

For reasons appearing to the Court, Ordered that the Overseers of the Poor send Harriet Johnson child of Abby Johnson to Thomas Dunford, according to Law. That the said Dunford pay \$12, annually for the service of the said Harriet Johnson, the ten dollars for the last years service to be paid the apprentice the residue of the service of said apprentice to be paid to the mother.

On the motion of June West, Ordered that Henry Kindred administrator of the estate of John J. West pay to the said June West the sum of \$120, for the board and clothing of James R. West orphan of John J. West, and the like sum of \$120 for the board & clothing of Henry J. West orphan of John J. West.
