The Commissioners heretofore appointed to view and report to the Court the propriety of changing the road on the South Side of Notterway River near Jesselton this day made their report which report is in the following words to wit.

Pursuant to the aforesaid order of the County Court of Southampton the undersigned commissioners by law respectfully to report that they have examined the ground on the south side of Notterway river near Jesselton with a view of changing the road between the two first bridges to a more safe and eligible site, and are of opinion that a good safe and passable road, at cost perhaps when the river is most unusually full, may be obtained by running the road some fifty or one hundred yards south of the present one, and at an expense of between three and five hundred dollars - Your Commissioners would represent that the present road runs immediately on the bank of the river, and from successive washings has become several feet lower than the surface of the adjacent ground which, on every side of the river, makes it exceedingly difficult and dangerous to pass from its peculiar liability to wash, in consequence of its location and from the fact that every fresh in the river washes it more and more. Your Commissioners exerted all the opinion that the day is not far distant, when it will become entirely impassable - The land over which the new road could run is of but very little value of any, being unfit for cultivation except a very small part of the corner of the field adjacent to the middle bridge.
