

Jacob H. Duck after giving at least twenty days notice of the time & place of sale at Jerusalem and at some place near the premises, sell to the highest bidder on a credit of six months; reserving for so much as will be necessary to pay expenses of this suit and of the sale which shall be for Cash, the land in Southampton now by held in dower by Mary, the widow of Shelly White, and which at the death which has occurred, belonged to Jacob H. Duck & wife Nancy Thomas White & John S. White and out of the proceeds pay first the costs of the suit and the expenses of sale and then pay to Jacob H. Duck & wife 1/3 pay to Thomas White 1/3 and then pay to the defendant John S. White the other 1/3 part, and that the said Commissioner do also after like notice, sell to the highest bidder on like terms, the slave Jacob who was the slave of said Mary in the estate of Shelly White, and pay over the proceeds as follows, that is to say 1/3 to Jacob H. Duck in right of his wife, 1/3 to Jacob H. Duck as purchaser of the interest in said slave from the aforesaid Thomas White and the other third to the defendant John S. White, that the Commissioner take from the purchasers lands with good security in such way as to enable him to pay over the same and if the said John S. White shall not appear & receive his portion the Commissioner shall bring the land for his share into this Court to be sold in this cause, subject to the future order of the Court - make a deed to the purchaser - and make report in order to a final decree.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till to morrow morning 9 o'clock
