But this execution may be discharged by the payment of fifteen dollar and eighty cents with interest from 16th May 1782 till paid and the costs

Matthew Mountford who stands bound by recognizance for his appearance here to answer the complaint of Baldy Mountford against him for a breach of the peace this day appeared in discharge of his recognizance - and the said Baldy Mountford being sworn and examined and the said Matthew Mountford being fully heard it is the opinion of the Court & accordingly ordered that the said Matthew Mountford do find security for keeping the peace for the term of 12 months from this day, the said Matthew Mountford to be bound on a recognizance in the sum of \$20 with two securities in the sum of \$10 each, and that he also pay the costs of this prosecution. Whereupon the said Matthew Mountford with Anthony M Howell & Fielding S Mahone his securities have in court solemnly acknowledge themselves indebted unto John M Gregory Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia that is to say the said Matthew Mountford in the sum of \$20 and the said Howell & Mahone in the sum of \$10 each of their respective goods & chattels lands & tenements to be levied & to the said Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor and his successors in the office of Governor to the use of the Commonwealth. Yet upon this condition that if the said Matthew Mountford shall keep the peace & be of good behaviour towards all the citizens of the Commonwealth more especially towards the said Baldy Mountford for the term of twelve months from this day then the recognizance to be void.

On the motion of James B Maffentray. Ordered that Master Commissioner Cobb examine the books & settle an additional account of the said Maffentray's administration on John Blount estate & make report thereof to the Court with any matters specially stated & demanded pertinent by himself or which he may be advised to state.

For reasons appearing to the Court. Ordered that late sheriff & administrator of William Jenkins do pay to Elizabeth Jenkins the widow of the said William Jenkins the balance due upon the settlement of his administration account.
