to answer the complaint of Baldy Mountford against him for a breach of the peace  
this day appeared in discharge of his recognizance - and the said Baldy Mount-  
ford being sworn and examined and the said Matthew Mountford being fully heard  
it is the opinion of the Court accordingly ordered that the said Matthew Mountford  
do give security for keeping the peace for the term of 12 months from this day. the  
said Matthew Mountford to be bound on a recognizance in the sum of £20 with  
two securities in the sum of £10 each and that he also pay the costs of the prosecution.  
Whereupon the said Matthew Mountford with Anthony Howell & Fielding  
Mahone his securities herein court severally acknowledge themselves indebted unto  
John M. Gregory Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor of the Commonwealth  
of Virginia that is to say the said Matthew Mountford in the sum of £20 and  
the said Howell & Mahone in the sum of £10 each of this respective good & chaste  
lands & tenement to be levied & to the said Lieutenant Governor acting as Gov-  
ernor and his successors in the office of Governor to the use of the Commonwealth  
rendered. Yet upon this condition that of the said Matthew Mountford shall  
keep the faith & be of good behaviour towards all the citizens of the Commonwealth  
more especially towards the said Baldy Mountford for the term of twelve months  
from this day then this recognizance to be void.

On the motion of James D. Mapenby. Ordered that Master Commissioner Cobb examine  
Hale & with an additional account of the said Mapenby's administration on John  
Blunt's estate & make report thereof to Court with any material specially stated therein  
pertinent by himself or which he may be required to state.

administrator of William Jenkins do<sup>re</sup> pay to Elizabeth Jenkins the widow of the  
said William Jenkins the balance due upon the settlement of his administration account
