Boykin in the sum of one hundred & forty dollars and the said John Boykin in the like sum of one hundred and forty dollars of their respective goods & chattels lands & tenements to be levied and to the said Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor to the use of the Commonwealth undevd. Yet upon this condition that if the said John P. Boykin shall observe and keep the above order of the Court made against him then the said recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force.
