grapes, &c as acknowledged in the Clerks Office the 15th day of September 1842 by
all the parties thereunto and admitted to Record.

Deed of trust between William Kirk of the first part Thomas Royal of the second
part and John Grealish of the third part conveying side boards, corn fields
beds and furniture and other personal property was acknowledged in the Clerks
Office on the 15th September 1842 by Vick Royal one of the parties thereunto and admitted
to Record.

Deed of trust between John H. Woodford of the first part Sam'l W. Somers of the
second part and Alexander McLemore of the third part conveying horses, cattle
beds and furniture chairs and other personal property was acknowledged in the
Clerks Office on the 17th September 1842 by all the parties thereunto and admitted to Record.

Deed of Release from Bennett A. Whitfield and John Angeroy & H. M. Cutts
relating a certain tract of land was found in the Clerks Office on the 17th day of
