The Commissioner, appointed by the interfering decree in this cause, this day made the following report: Agreeable to a Decree of the County Court of Southampton bearing date August Court 1841, and decrees amended, and also in order to carry into effect the last Will and Testament of Hartwell Hart Esq. after having advertised in sundry places in many of the adjacent Counties as well as in Southampton Town giving long and sufficient notice of the sale; I have sold at public Auction on a credit of nine months, from the 1st day of November 1841. The land and slaves belonging to the Estate of the aforesaid Hartwell Hart Esq. for the sum of \$2972. I have in the first place deducted from this amount of sales \$150 for the Clerk and Lawyer fees, and in the next place the further sum of one hundred and forty eight Dollars and sixty cents for Commissions, for advertising, selling &c leaving a neat balance due of \$2803.40. One sixth of which sum I am agreeable to the said decree directed to pay to Polly Hart the widow of the said Hartwell Hart Esq. which is \$463.06 2/3 for which sum I have taken Thomas Allison's bond with good and sufficient security for the said Mrs. Polly Hart the widow of the aforesaid Hartwell Hart Esq. and have paid the said bond of \$463.06 2/3 over to her the said Polly Hart and taken her receipt for the same as will appear on the back of this report, and in further obedience of the aforesaid decree the other 5/6 amounting to \$2340.33 1/3, I have retained in my hands as the Executor of the said Hartwell Hart Esq. in order to carry into execution the provision of the said Hartwell Hart last Will and Testament, as directed by the said decree or order.
