

of had two distinct parcels, one necessarily small and diminished in value by reason of its detached situation. Your Commissioners therefore thought it most advisable to apportion and set a part to Mary Buttle the mother her share and divide the residue into six shares as nearly equal as circumstances and locality would permit, but they found it necessary to require the parties to pay and receive small pecuniary sums under to bring about the equality desired. The aggregate value of the land was found to be six thousand two hundred and thirteen dollars.

The proportion of Mary Buttle the mother being one forty ninth amounted to one hundred and twenty six dollars and 82 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents we apportioned to her the Barn and Baker's property tract valued at \$106.00 and twenty dollars and 82 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents to be paid in money leaving to be divided into six shares.

And making one thousand and fourteen dollars 36 $\frac{2}{3}$ cents for share and divided as follows:
