Your commissioners therefore thought it not advisable to ascertain and set apart to Mary Butler the Mother her share and divide the residue into six shares as nearly equal as circumstances and locality would permit. but they found it necessary to require the parties to pay and receive small pecuniary sums, so as to bring about the equality desired. The aggregate value of the land was found to be six thousand two hundred and thirteen Dollars.

The proportion of Mary Butler the Mother being one sixth amounting to one hundred and twenty six dollars and 80 cts we assigned to her the Barn and Butter Flyper tracts valued at
