This day this cause came on to be heard on the Bill and answer, by leave of Court and

months except for so much as may be necessary to pay the cost of this decree, which he
is to receive on the day of sale in Cash and that he take of the purchase thus made
one for one seventh part of the whole, which he is to assign to Mary Manly, one for
one forth part of the remainder which he is to assign to guardian ad litem to the
children of John Manly and one other land for the remainder which he is to assign
to Thomas Manly and report to this Court in order to a final decree.
