Deed of Gift from John S. Swalling to the children of Thomas M. Florence M. Bailey conveying a lot or parcel of negroes (now in the possession of the said John S. Swalling in right of his wife) and their increase was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 21st day of January 1843, by said Swalling & admitted to Record.

Deed of trust between Solomon B. Barham of the first part Littleton R. Edwards of the second part and John M. Gurley Seth R. Strong W. Fielding J. Mahone Daniel H. Dringore L. L. Passon William W. Whitehead, Charles Waller William Carter and all the other creditors of the said Solomon B. Barham of the third part conveying negro slaves was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 21st day of January 1843, by Barham Edward Gurley & Mahone four of the parties thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of trust between Benjamin Bann of the first part (Carpenter) Rochelle of the second part and James Magot Trustee of the third part conveying land negro slaves horses cattle hogs and other personal property was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 21st day of January 1843, by all the parties thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Thomas J. Butler to Thomas Butler conveying land was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 21st day of January 1843, by said J. Butler and admitted to Record.

Deed of trust between Arthur C. Magid of the first part, Emile Barr of the second part and George H. Cump Trustee of the third part, conveying a negro slave horses cattle hogs and other personal property, was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 1st day of February 1843, by all the parties thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from Joseph T. Williams to William S. Williams conveying his (J. T. W.) interest in a certain tract of land was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 2nd day of February 1843, by said J. T. Williams & admitted to Record.

Deed of trust between John W. Kern of the first part Mark T. Fule of the second part and Sampson B. Reese, Nathaniel Francis, John Breun & Henry Moore all of the third part, conveying land, negro slaves, horses cattle and other personal property was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 3rd day of February 1843, by J. W. Kern & Mark T. Fule two of the parties thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of trust between William S. Williams of the first part Ignatius S. Williams of the second part and Thomas J. Butler of the third part, conveying his (W. S. Williams) interest in a certain tract of land (including the interest in the within described William S. Williams dec'd.) and one negro slave was acknowledged in the Clerk's Office the 4th day of February 1843, by all the parties thereto and admitted to Record.

Deed of bargain and sale from John R. Booth to Edwards Butler conveying his (J. R. B.) interest in Peter Booth estate was proved in the Clerk's Office the 4th day of January 1843, by the oath of William A. Bell a witness thereto. And in the Clerk's Office the 4th day of February 1843 this deed was proved by the oath of Patrick R. Rollings another witness thereto and admitted to Record.
