The Commissioners appointed to make sale of the land mentioned in this cause this  
 day made the following report. "In compliance with the attached decree two hundred  
 and two thousand dollars were paid to the Commissioners after having given twenty days notice of the time and  
 place of sale and on the premises on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of November 1842. and resold to  
 public sale the tract of land herein mentioned on a credit of nine months after and  
 when William Bryant became the purchaser for the sum of ninety Dollars which I  
 sum we divided as follows to wit we deducted eleven dollars to defray expenses of  
 L. sale which left a balance of seventy nine dollars for the one half of which say balance  
 nine dollars and 50<sup>cts</sup> we took a note payable nine months after date and assigned  
 it to William G. Stephenson in his own right the last day thirty nine dollars and 80<sup>cts</sup>  
 we divided in the following way First we took a note for one tenth say six dollars  
 50<sup>cts</sup> payable in nine months and assigned it to Polly Stephenson widow of Henry  
 Stephenson in her name the last day thirty two Dollars and 75<sup>cts</sup> we took three  
 notes of equal amount payable in nine months day for ten 75<sup>cts</sup> each which we filed  
 in the Clerk's office as to be done directed all which proceedings we respectfully  
 submit to the Court. Given under our hands this 30<sup>th</sup> Nov. 1842. Attest. Myself
