A. Stone the following negroes Chlce. Scott, Nancy, Henry, Jerome Lydia & Marshall
and to receive fifty dollars from Virginia Ann Stone. January 7th 1863 R. H. Ridgley

This day the cause was docketed by Court and consent of parties and came on to be heard
on the bill and answer and was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth
order adjudged & decree that Nathaniel Brown, James E. Peters and Harry Colley to appear
as Commissioners of this court, that they or any two of them, be authorized to let out of
George Rawlings dec'd for sale to satisfy the claim of G. J. Murray such negroes as may
be best suited from the estate, and that they offer said sale to the highest bidder
upon a credit of six months, after advertising the time and place of sale for twenty days
and pay over the funds to G. J. Murray upon this releasing the trust they held in the
estate, that they divide the remainder of the estate to the real personal into four
equal parts and let one share to William Owen in right of his wife and to William
Brantley in right of his wife, one to Samuel Pauling in his own right and the other
to William H. Pauling in his own right and that they report their proceedings to the
Court in order to a final decree. The Court doth further order that the children
who have been educated shall advance notably for the education of those uneducated
