

At a Court called & held for the County of Southampton at the Courthouse of
said County on the 11th day of March 1820, for the trial of the complaint of Robert J.
Butler against Silas Vick for unlawful detainer by virtue of the Act of Assembly
entitled "An Act to explain and amend an Act," reducing into one, the several
Acts concerning forcible entries and detainers."

This day came the said Robert J. Butler by his attorney and filed his bill of
complaint of unlawful detainer against Silas Vick, whereupon came also the defen-
dant Silas Vick in his pro per son, and thereupon came a jury to wit. Matthew
Wells, Mills D. Pammel, Meredith Holland, William V. Edwards, Thomas Stanley,
Harrison & Moore, Hardy Pauls, Josiah C. Smith, Patrick Rose, Spratt & Williams,
Alfred Cobb, Nathan Brooker, who being by consent of parties sworn according to Law
upon their oaths returned a verdict in the following words Be it w^t. We the jury find that
the defendant did not at the time of the exhibition of the Complaint file in this cause
hold possession of the tenements therein mentioned against the consent of the plaintiff, that
the said defendant hath not so held possession thereof against the consent of the plaintiff
for three years next before the exhibition of said complaint, and that the plaintiff
hath not the right of possession in the tenement aforesaid. Thereon it is considered by
the Court that the complaint aforesaid be dismissed, and that the Defendant recover
against the plaintiff his costs in this behalf expended.
