Myrick who stands charged with having on the 18th day of January 1823 in the County feloniously forged a note against Nancy Miller of the said County which note purports to be executed by the said Nancy Miller to the said Joshua H. Myrick for the payment of the sum of One hundred dollars was again set to the law in custody of the keeper of the jail of said County. Whereupon sundry witnesses were sworn and examined & the prisoner by counsel fully heard, the Court after hearing the testimony and from all the circumstances of the case, are of opinion that the said Joshua H. Myrick ought to be tried for the said offence at the next Circuit Superior Court of Law of Chancery held here for this County. And thereupon he is remanded to jail.
