

For reasons appearing to the Court. Ordered that Joseph T. Filer Edward Beaton and Nathaniel Williams or any two of them do view & report to the Court the propriety of letting out the repairs of the Bridge across the Samara Creek on the road leading from the Camp Site to Danahoe Bridge & the road near there, to the Court and make report to the Court.

Ordered that the Sheriff summon the Justices of this County to June Term next to take into consideration the propriety of restoring the embankment on the west side of the Notaway River near Jerusalem.

Ordered that Henry At Newson Fielding J. Mahone & William S. Brindley or any two of them let to the Court and make report to the Court the propriety of letting out the repairs of the embankment on the west side of the Notaway River near Jerusalem & make report then of to the Court.

On Motion of Shugart Sain, Ordered that Master Commissioner Cobb examine state & settle an account of the said Shugart Sain transactions as Executor of Catherine Sain and make report thereof to the Court with any matter specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or which he may be required so to state.

The last Will & Testament of William Felt d. d. was proved by the oaths of Harmon D. Mone & James T. Mone two of the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the Motion of Elizabeth F. Felt the executors therein named who made oath (and gave bond & the Will directing no security should be given, and the Court requiring same) in the penalty of five thousand Dollars, conditioned as the law directs, certificate is granted her for obtaining probate of said Will in due form.

On the Motion of Henry Mason Ordered that the undistributed estate of Martha Newson d. d. be committed to the hands of William S. Everett Sheriff of this County for administration according to Law.

On the Motion of James Clayton against Edward Beaton & Levi Waller. This day came the Plaintiff by his attorney, and it appearing to the Court that the Defendants have had legal notice of the Motion. They were solemnly called but came not. Therefore it is considered by the Court that the Plaintiff recover against the Defendants the sum of thirteen dollars and twenty five cents with interest thereon from the 28th day of December 1832 till paid. It being for a claim placed in the hands of Thomas B. B. as Constable of Southampton County (for whom the said Defendants were security) to warrant on in favour of the State of Benjamin Blunt. And also that the Plaintiff recover against the Defendants his costs by him in this behalf expended. And the said Defendants in Marriage.

For reasons appearing to the Court. Ordered that Thomas Lawrence son of John B. Barden d. d. pay to Ursella Barden the widow of said John B. Barden the sum of thirty seven dollars and twenty five cents with interest on thirty three dollars and nineteen cents paid thereof from the 28th day of December 1841 till paid that being the whole amount due from the said Thomas
