Whitfield his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond, in the penalty of fifty hundred dollars, a condition as the law directs: Whereupon in his Motion, a testimonial is granted him in due form.

Anthony McNeill who stands charged in writ by James Warren a free single woman of this County, with being the father of her bastard child, this day appeared in Court in discharge of his recognizance, and thereupon the said James Warren and another witness was sworn and examined, and the said McNeill by his Counsel fully heard, the Court after hearing the testimony and from all the circumstances of the case; on of opinion and do therefore adjudge the said Anthony McNeill to be the father of the said bastard child, and that the said child is likely to become chargeable to the County. Therefore it is ordered that the said Anthony McNeill be charged with the annual payment of Twenty Dollars, for the space of seven years, from the birth of the said child to wit, the 15th day of February 1820, and that he pay the same annually to the Officers of the Court of this County from the said 15th day of February 1820, to the full term of seven years, in case the said child shall live so long and that he also pay the costs of this prosecution. Whereupon the said Anthony McNeill with Harrison Soper & Satter Cobb his securities being Court severally acknowledged themselves indebted unto the Commonwealth of Virginia, that is to say the said McNeill in the sum of One hundred and forty dollars, and the said Harrison Soper and Satter Cobb in the sum of seventy dollars each to be levied of their respective goods, chattels, lands & tenements & to the use of the Commonwealth within. Yet upon this condition that if the said Anthony McNeill shall obtain & perform the order of the Court when made against him, then the above recognizance to be void, or else to remain in full force & return.
