

Wherefore it is ordered that the said John Griffin pay to the Owners of the Son of this Court twenty dollars annually for the space of seven years from the birth of the said child to wit, from the 15th day of April 1842, in case the said child should live so long. And the said John Griffin do also pay the cost of the proceedings. And the said John Griffin refusing to enter into recognizance with security for the performance of the above order it is ordered that the said John Griffin be committed to the Common Jail of the County for detainers, until he shall give the said security to be discharged by due course of law.

Absent John Vick Present Robert D. Griffin Court

James Vick who stands charged on oath by Margaret Seyner a free single woman of this County with being the father of her bastard child appeared in Court in discharge of her recognizance and therefore the said Margaret Seyner & sundry witnesses were sworn and examined and the said Vick by his Counsel fully heard. The Court after hearing the testimony read from all the circumstances of the case doth adjudge that the said James Vick is not the father of the said bastard child. Wherefore it is ordered that this complaint be dismissed.

Henry Warner, Henry Snipes & William Snipes who stand bound by a recognizance to their appearance here this day, to answer the complaint of Lucy Cobb against them for a breach of the peace appeared accordingly. No answer appearing to the Court this recognizance is continued till the next Term.
