various places the time and place of sale of the lands of which Matthew Legum died seized was
at the 17th day of December in the year 1802 publicly asking for sale on the premises the above named
lands at which time and place William Atkinson became the purchaser for the sum of twelve hundred
and thirty one dollar that being the highest bid made, after deducting seventy five dollars in money
balance of two hundred eighty six dollars and twenty seven cents each one of which we assigned to Donnell
& Buffin and wife, and the other three to Allen Edwards guardian of Charles M Legum Sarah

This day the cause was docketed by him of the Court, and by consent of parties came on to be heard with bill
and answer, and was argued by Counsel, the consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge order and
showed, that the slaves of which Jesse C. Summerville died seized he sold to the highest bidder, on
a credit of nine months (the days previous notice of the time and place of sale being first given) and
that the Commissioners took of the purchase or purchasing bonds with good security in such amount
as to allow one fifth of the whole purchase money to George C. Summerville, one fifth to Joseph C. Sum-
merville, one fifth to the legal Guardian of Julia Ann one fifth to the legal Guardian of Cornelius and
the remaining fifth to the legal Guardian of Caroline Summerville, that James B. Hargreaves be
appointed Commissioner to carry this decree into effect, who is required to report to Court in order to a
final decree.

Our Motion of Melrose Stephenson who made oath and together with Joseph C. Council and William
Drisham his decedent's widow into and solemnly set up a bond in the penalty of five hundred dollars and
obtained as the law directs, certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on Jesse's estate in due form.
