The Complainants appalled by the interlocuting decree in this cause, this day made their report which said
 report is in the words of same to wit "We the undersigned complainants have considered the above decree
 in the following manner to wit after first having given you reasonable notice by publickly advertising at
 various place the time and place of sale of the lands of which Matthew Lyman died deceased etc.
 die on the 17th day of December in the year 1802 publickly setting forth on the premises the above named
 lands at which time and place William Abbin became the purchaser for the sum of two hundred
 and twenty one dollars that being the highest bid made after deducting security for debts amounting
 there out that being the cost of the sale We took four equal bonds with sufficient security for the
 balance of two hundred eighty six dollars and twenty seven cent each one of which we agreed to Bennett
 J Griffin and wife and the other three to Alice Edwards guardian of Charles M Lyman Sarah
 Lyman and Matthew Lyman the receipt for which are herewith appalled" Respectfully Submitted

On Motion of James B Urquhart who made oath and together with Charles B Urquhart and
 A H Urquhart his sonnties entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two thousand
 dollars and three cents direct certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on
 Genl C Summerville estate in due form

Ordered that Arthur H Holloman, John Boykin Justice Bryan John Brown and Bartholomew
 Bowers or any three of them being first duly sworn for the purpose before a justice of the peace affix all the
 personal estate of Genl C Summerville &c and return the appointment under the hands to County

George C Summerville and Joseph C Summerville

This day this cause was docketed by leave of the Court and by consent of parties came on to be heard with bill
 and answer, and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge order and
 decree, that the slaves of which Genl C Summerville died specified be sold to the highest bidder, on
 a day of nine month (the day preceding either of the time and place of sale being first given) and
 that the Complainant take of the purchaser or purchasing bond with great security in such amount
 as to allow one fifth of the whole purchase money to George C Summerville, one fifth to Joseph C Sum-
 merville, one fifth to the legal Guardian of George C Summerville and one fifth to the legal Guardian of Cornelius and
 the remaining fifth to the legal Guardian of Caroline Summerville, that James B Urquhart be
 appointed Commissioner to carry this decree into effect, who is required to report to Court in order to a
 final decree

On Motion of Nelson Stephenson who made oath and together with Joseph C Council and Willis
 Westover his attorney entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of six hundred dollars con-
 sidering at the last decree, certificate is given to his furthering letter of administration in Justice Johnson estate in due form
