Pittman James Pittman & Ann Sutton their deponents entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Eight Thousand Dollars conditioned as the law directs, certificate granted them for Mastering all port of said Will in due form.

Ordered that John Moore & Robert Ricks Robert Murray & Robert Pittman or any three of them first be sworn before Justices of the Peace for the purpose, appraise all the personal estate of Thomas Pittman et al. and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

Willis Raule of the County of Southampton aforesaid charged with having feloniously stolen certain
silver ware from one Jacob Ellinger of said County the sum of two hundred & thirty dollars in Bank notes or
bills purporting to be of the Farmers Bank of Virginia Bank of Va. and Bank of Cape Fear in the State of North
Carolina the property of the said Jacob Ellinger, was set to the bar in custody of the Sheriff of the said
County (the Court summing up for the examination of the said Willis Raule having failed to do so) and
thereupon diversly were sworn and examined, and the person by his Counsel fully heard. The Court after fully
considering the testimony from the circumstance of the case are of opinion that the person ought to be
tried for the said offence at the next Term of the Circuit Superior Court of Law Chamber to be held for
the County. And therefore the present remanded to Jail.
