The Commissioners heretofore appointed to let the repairs & rebuilding of Mathey Bridge over of the Turnpike on the day next the following report to wit: "We Peter Edwards John A. Benson and William S. Everett of the Commissioners appointed by an order of the County Court of Southampton, to act jointly with Council of the Turnpike Road of Brunswick for the purpose of repairing or rebuilding Mathey Bridge over of the Turnpike and after examining the old bridge we were unanimously of opinion that it was necessary to erect a new bridge. Therefore on the 2^d day of July 1843 jointly with the Commissioners from Brunswick we proceeded to let the rebuilding of the bridge to the lowest bidder, leaving it at the option of the contractor to erect it over the old site or not to be not less than 18 feet above the old bridge, to be completed by the 15th day of October 1843 equal to or better than the old bridge and a new bridge to be equal to the old bridge, we recommended and highly then dollar and on the 15th day of October at the request of a great crowd we recommended a new bridge and unanimously with the Council of Brunswick were of opinion it was built equal to the old bridge, therefore it was not by us. All of which are hereby respectfully submitted to the County Court of Southampton for their examination and approval signed by us this 15th day of October 1843 at Brunswick Peter Edwards John A. Benson Wm S. Everett."
