

According to an order of the several Courts of Southampton County, August 1842. We the undersigned, us of the Defendants before, in due course have presented to London the case of Edmund Teller and Lydia Countess of Southampton and Esquire, attended by Mr. D. Nicol, Esq. who surveyed said land and found there to be in the whole tract four hundred and fifty six acres which we have divided as represented on the foregoing plan as follows to wit, four of the aforesaid Martha Teller as her share in due course one hundred and fifty acres by two parallel lines running southward from Richard H. Sharp's line to Richard N. Williams' line represented in due course by due lines enclosing the house which are considered to be equal in value to one of the whole tract of land leaving it to be the interest of the former concerned and to divide the property of a future division of said four acres into four parcels the whole tract of land into three parts equal in value each part containing a portion of the Dover land, as follows Lot No^o 1 containing two hundred and seventeen acres drawn by Benjamin Clarke & Elizabeth his wife Fifty nine acres of which is enclosed in the Dover land and bounded by the lands of Richard N. Williams Thomas J. Hartman and William M. Glenny Lot No^o 2 by a line running from a point being standing in said M. Glenny's S^o 27 & 325 poles to a small black gum a corner on said Richard N. Williams line above Lot or lot No^o 2 containing one hundred and fifty six acres drawn by Martha Teller (esq'r) thirty four acres of which is enclosed in the Dover land and bounded by the lands of Richard N. Williams and the above mentioned line of lot No^o 1 by the lands of William M. Glenny & Patrick H. Sharp & Lot No^o 3 by a line running from the centre of 2 the orange I pointed a small oak standing on said Patrick H. Sharp's line S^o 1 & 307 pole to a maple standing in said Richard N. Williams' line Lot No^o 3 containing one hundred and seventy nine acres drawn by Elizabethina Teller (fifty seven acres of which is enclosed in the Dover land) and bounded by the lands of Patrick H. Sharp Richard N. Williams and the above mentioned line of lot No^o 2 all of which is respectively submitted to the Court Seven witness our hands this 10th day of August 1842.
