

Accordingly to an order of the Honorable Justices of the Supreme Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, made at the Court held at Boston the 14th day of August 1843. We the undersigned one of the Commissioners of the Land Office have proceeded to divide the land of Benjamin Miller and George W. Smith of South Hampton and Brunswick attended by John B. Merrill and George W. Smith who amongst last land was found there to be in the whole about five hundred and fifty two acres which we have divided as represented on the foregoing plat as follows to wit: First the section March 25th 1830 as the same in said land one hundred and fifty acres by two parallel lines running across said land from Peter's to the Shop's line to Richard A. Williams line represented on said plat by the lines enclosing the house which we consider to be equal in value to that of the whole tract of land believing it to be to the interest of the parties concerned and to facilitate the necessity of a future division of said seven land we have divided the whole tract of land into three parts equal in value to each other each lot contains a portion of the Dover land, as follows Lot No 1 containing three hundred and seventeen acres drawn by Benjamin Clarke & Elizabeth bearing fifty two acres of which is enclosed in the Dover land, and bounded by the land of Richard A. Williams Thomas J. H. H. and William M. H. H. Lot No 2 by a line running from a small barn standing on said M. H. H. to a small black gum or corner in said Richard A. Williams line thence Lot or Lot No 3 containing one hundred and fifty acres drawn by March 25th 1830 (copy) thirty four acres of which is enclosed in the Dover land, and bounded by the land of Richard A. Williams and the above mentioned line of Lot No 1, by the land of William M. H. H. & Richard A. Shop's Lot No 3 by a line running from the corner of the large square to a small oak standing on said Peter's to the Shop's line Lot or Lot No 4 567 poles to a maple standing in said Richard A. Williams line Lot No 5 containing one hundred and seventy nine acres drawn by Christiana Miller (fifty seven acres of which is enclosed in the Dover land) and bounded by the line of Peter's to the Shop's Richard A. Williams and the above mentioned line of Lot No 2, all of which is respectfully submitted to the Court. Given under our hands this 10th day of August 1843
