decrees that Benjamin Griffen who is appointed a Commissioner for that purpose do after giving
ten days previous notice of the time and place of sale, sell to the highest bidder on account of sums
overdue, except such sufficient to defray the expenses of the sale, the tract of land of which Mrs.
Rhoda Morel died seized property containing by estimation 150 acres, and take bids and
security of the purchaser so as to sell one fourth to Henry Lewis Burgess, one fourth to
Willie Gardner son of Joseph one sixth to A. J. Burgess in right of his wife Martha,
one sixth to Joseph Gardner in right of his wife Martha and the remaining sixth to
John G. Griffen infant son of R. G. Griffen by his first wife dying. That the Commissioner upon
the bonds entitled to these legal question shall be made a deed to the purchaser with special
