And therefore the said Edmund D. Marcell with Benjamin D. Marcell, Augustus Peirce and Anthony M. Marcell his brothers who were jointly affirmed by the Court and accepted by the said Marcell entered into and acknowledged a bond according to the above order.

Richard Johnson who stands charged with having feloniously killed taken and carried away from the body of white male slave of the value of five hundred the property of Abram Rockwell in the County of Franklin and set to the law in custody of the keeper of the jail of this County (The said Rockwell for his execution having failed to meet.) The Court after hearing the testimony and from all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the said Richard Johnson ought to be tried further than offered at the next Circuit Superior Court of Law and Pleas to be held for this County. And on the motion of the said Richard Johnson he is allowed to give his bond to stand in the sum of fifty dollars with two witnesses to be bound in the like sum of \$50 dollars for his formal appearance before the judge of this said Circuit Superior Court of Law and Pleas for this County on the first day of the next Term thereof to stand his trial for the felony aforesaid. And therefore the said Johnson is commanded to go into the said said to stand.
