

On the motion of Nathl. Howell who made oath and together with Robert S. Griffin and a C. S. B. Rogers his friends entered into and acknowledged a bond on the penalty of One thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs and signed him for obtaining release of said commitment on the release of Bury Howell directed on this point.

Ordered that Nathl. Howell, Benjamin Griffin and John Canty being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose as aforesaid, all the personal estate of Bury Howell deceased return the aforesaid under their hands to Court.

§ 203

On the motion of Thomas W. Howell administrator of Matthew White deceased, against John B. Howell for return of property. This day came the parties who being fully heard as was ordered by the Court that the said B. Howell give the said Howell administrator as aforesaid, good and lawful security according to law, the bond for which purpose it is to be on the penalty of One thousand dollars made payable to Thomas W. Howell administrator as aforesaid, and conditioned according to law. And that the said B. Howell pay to the said Howell administrator as aforesaid, his debt by him in due behalf expended, and throughout the said debt B. Howell with Benjamin W. Howell, Augustus Egan and Anthony H. Howell his executors who were deemed sufficient by the Court and accepted by the said Howell administrator who and authorized a bond according to the above order.

Present Bury Howell Court

Richard Johnson who stands charged with having feloniously stolen, taken and carried away two or three kinds of substantial stores of the value of five dollars, the property of Thomas R. Roberts in the County of Southampton, and did to the law in contrary of the Reciprocity of the part of this County (the Court commenced for his examination having failed to meet). And thereupon standing indicted were sworn and examined and the prisoner by Counsel fully heard. The Court after hearing the testimony and from all the circumstances of the case, are of opinion that the said Richard Johnson ought to be tried for the said offense at the next Circuit Superior Court of law and Chancery to be held for this County. And on the motion of the said Richard Johnson he is allowed to give bail himself to be bound on the sum of fifty dollars with two sureties to be bound on the like sum of fifty dollars for his personal appearance before the Judge of the said Court Superior Court of law and Chancery for this County on the first day of the next Term thereof, to stand his trial for the felony aforesaid. And thereupon the said Johnson is recommended to jail until the said bail is given.
