The defendant who was arrested under the writ of Capias awarded against him this day appeared in discharge of his recognizance, and being fully bound remanded by the Court that he be discharged again.

The last Will and Testament of Henry Harrison deceased was proved by the wills of Israel A. Brown and William D. Everett the subscribers witness thereto and sworn to be recited. Testimony R. Edwards and Howell Morris two of the executors thereto witness affirmed in Court and agreed to take upon themselves the burthen of the execution of said will, one witness of Edwards to take the other witness thereof named who made oath and together James H. Parker and William J. Howell his deponents interlock hands and acknowledged a sum in the penalty of One thousand dollars tendered at the last direct affidavit as a bond for standing in protest of the said will in due form.

Ordered that John C. Turner, William D. Everett, Edward P. James and Israel A. Brown in any three of them being first duly sworn before a justice of the peace do appraise all the personal and real estate of Henry Harrison dec^d which may be shown produced or shown and return the appraisement under their hands & bonds.

Plaintiff S. Whitfield having obtained an attachment against the estate of George Whitfield for twenty dollars forty eight cents with interest from the 25th day of October 1848 due by note, subject to a credit of four dollars and twelve cents paid on the 7th October 1848, and the plaintiff having made return that he had "attached so much of the stipended amount as will pay the above amount less of twenty six dollars forty eight cents due from February 28th till paid, as well as the costs incurred by serving out this Bank account of the said note within named George Whitfield in the hands of the trustee Elizur D. Howell as trustee of James Henry dec^d" as by the warrant & was required; and have caused the said Thomas D. Howell to appear before the said Court, to be held for Southampton County to declare what effects he hath in his hands belonging to the said George Whitfield or how much he is indebted to him. His day cause the plaintiff by his attorney and the defendant not appearing Thomas D. Howell administrator of James Henry the garnishee appeared and being sworn and examined. It is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the said George Whitfield the sum of twenty dollars forty eight cents with interest therefrom from 25th day of October 1848 till paid, subject to a credit of \$4 for paid 7th October 1848 and his costs by him in this behalf expended. And it is ordered that Thomas D. Howell administrator as aforesaid as well as any person who may hereafter come to his hands belong ing to the said George Whitfield supply the same or as much thereof as may be different to pay his judgment to the plaintiff.
